I am very happy with the help I received to enable me to use the phone and I-pad again"


I requested a lift to go to a nature event at Testwood Lakes. A really nice lady and her two children accompanied me. It was good for my wellbeing.

Timebanking UK are the custodians of timebanking and are the only organisation in the UK to offer resources and support to help implement and develop timebanking networks.


We pride ourselves on our robust safeguardng mechanisms to minimise risk. Our speciality is person to person timebanking - people helping other people in communities.

Timebank Health Buddies



What is it?

Timebank members can become Timebank Health Buddies and offer support and practical help to each other in times of need. The Health Buddies may offer transport to medical appointments, collecting prescriptions, companionship and help after coming home from hospital. All help and support offered

will be welcome, and the Buddies can agree in advance what they can and can't do for each other.

How does it work?

At least 2 individual Timebank members who know each other or get to know each other can choose to become Timebank Health Buddies. Based on liking and trusting each other, they agree that should they find themselves admitted to hospital or unwell at home, they will offer each other support. The Buddies will complete an agreement which will contain contact details and exactly what each is able to do for the other.

Should either need help, they will contact their Timebank Health Buddy or a Timebank Broker and let them know what help is needed. This is a person to person Time Exchange and will work the same as the existing Timebank scheme with 1 hour of time worth 1 hour of credit. The Timebank Broker will also be contacted so that Timebank hours exchanged can be recorded.

The project welcomes all existing Timebank members and also hopes to attract new members.
