Ruth from the Thornhill Talent Club, a Timebank organisational member, talks about her experience giving time to Southampton Children's Play Association.

"When I saw a Timebank request had arrived asking for work experience volunteers to give some hours to the SCPA Southampton Children's Play Association, I was very interested to have a go, especially as I used to be one of the kids at their playscheme when I was younger! I was really lucky to be accepted and found myself in my first ever interview with Anna the manager of the SCPA office. The staff were very friendly and used to helping new people find out how the equipment works, where the stores are kept and what type of training notes need to be prepared for the next meeting. They answered all my questions and took the time to explain to me how the SCPA is different from other schemes as it is providing activities chosen by the children themselves.

Once I settled into my work experience I was given an opportunity to also help at the annual big Fun day in Hoglands Park and the local summer playschemes. At the AGM we were given a lovely surprise award for our time as well as earning my Timebank credit! This year I have returned to SCPA to work at Weston as well, because it is great to find an organisation that helps young people find work experience outside of school terms. I have grown in confidence through taking part in this Timebank request, and I learnt other important skills such as planning my travel time to work, being a good timekeeper and team member.

Hearing from the experts has also increased my knowledge and I really enjoyed meeting up with the children again from last year's playschemes to see how they have all grown and catch up on their news over the year."
