# The New Help the Homeless in Southampton

The volunteers work really hard all year round supplying warm meals to Southampton's homeless and low income residents.

They need and use every week on a regular basis:Tea bags, coffee, sugar, milk, crisps, chocolate bars, breakfast bars and biscuits. They also give out toiletry packs so donations of hand wipes / baby wipes, toothpaste, soap, razors, pocket packs of tissues, shampoo/shower gels, toothbrushes and lip balms.

Cup-a-soups are great now it's getting colder, but it's their every day items they are really short of, as stated above. Having said that, items such as tins of meatballs, hotdog sausages, pasta and curry sauces always come in handy.

The group also receive regular requests for socks, underwear and sleeping bags.

**Please note:** no quilts, bedding, pillows, blankets, quilt covers or pillow cases. (Patrick House or Salvation Army will take these items).



We now have a good number of members who are offering to help with the **Support Buddy/Phone Buddy Scheme**. If you are in need of someone to visit/make an occasional phone call, please let us know so that we can put you in touch with one another.

What is offered? Here are just a few examples:

**Timebank Support Buddies:** Collecting prescriptions, Visiting at home, Lifts to appointments, Shopping, Pet sitting/walking, Offering companionship, Putting rubbish/dustbins out, Preparing/Taking round a meal, Helping someone settle in on return from hospital, etc

**Timebank Phone Buddies:** This is a scheme where people, who perhaps find it difficult to get out and about, offer to call each other for a chat. This could be a regular occurrence or a "one off" depending on what members want.

Both the above schemes can take as much or as little time as people have to spare.

**Don't forget:** we need members not only to offer help but also to ask, when needed, so that others can earn Time Credits.
